Reclaiming lost opportunities in HoA Ethiopia's top priority

ADDIS ABABA- Foreign Affairs Minister Ambassador Taye Atsekeselassie called upon governments of Horn of African (HoA) countries to work together to resolve differences peacefully and reclaim lost opportunities for shared growth.

In press briefing he issued yesterday, the Foreign Minister stressed that Ethiopia highly values the shared history and traditions with its neighboring countries.

"People in this region are no longer held hostage by past hostilities. Through continued interactions, they have forged inseparable bonds of friendship and a sense of community. It is thus futile to try to create a wedge between communities across borders. We should resolve differences peacefully and reclaim lost opportunities for shared growth," he restated.

Certain forces are exacerbating the political and diplomatic differences of Ethiopia and Somalia which he stated that collusion with these "forces hostile to peace in this region is also short-sighted and counterproductive".

Boosted exports, quality upgrades- Ethiopia's path to trade balance

Ethiopia's exports were 3.62 billion USD in 2023/24, while imports amounted to approximately 13.6 billion USD, resulting in a trade deficit of 9.98 billion USD. Bridging this gap requires strategic and sustained efforts.

Speaking to *The Ethiopian Herald*, Eastern Africa Grain Council (EAGC) Executive Director Gerald Masila stated that Ethiopia has a significant potential to diversify its foreign exchange earnings by expanding exports, particularly in grain value chains. Increasing exports of pulses, cereals, and grains could bring substantial income to the country.

To achieve this, Masila stressed the importance of addressingseveral issues, including harmonizing trade policies, standards, and specifications for

IGAD forecasts higher than normal temperatures in HoA

ADDIS AFABA (ENA) - The Greater Horn of Africa (HoA) region will have warmer than usual temperatures from September to November, the Climate Prediction and Applications Center (ICPAC) of the Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD), an East African bloc, remarked.

ICPAC noted in its latest update that the temperatures in some countries would rise to over 34 degrees Celsius.

"Drier than usual conditions expected over the eastern parts of the region during the September to November season with warmer than
